Student-Parent Handbook

All students will receive a student-parent handbook that they should review thoroughly together to ensure all rules and policies are understood. The handbook will be posted on our website and Facebook sites.





<u>My Family Room</u> represents the interface *that parents use* to set their contact preferences like phone numbers and email addresses. Parents can also view their sons' and daughters' Office 365 calendar through this interface.

It is important to emphasize that this service is for parent use only – in other words, *staff do not go into My Family Room to post or send information to parents*. To contact parents electronically, staff may use Office 365 (for routine class or school emails, to look up contact information or send calendar invitations to students) or alternatively, MIR3 for urgent notifications. <u>MIR3</u> is a system (website or mobile app) for principals, viceprincipals, office staff and central staff to send *urgent notifications directly to parents*. MIR3 has the capability to make tens of thousands of phone calls, emails or text messages in minutes and therefore is intended to contact parents in *urgent situations*. Specifically, we consider urgent communications to be:

• Unexplained Student Absences: MIR3 is now automatically making phone calls, emails and SMS text messages (as per the parent's preference) to notify parents when their son or daughter is absent without explanation, for both elementary and secondary students at all schools. You don't need to do anything for this to happen.

To Register for My Family Room call the general office at 613-678-2023 and ask to be added to MyFamilyRoom. All you need is an email address to register.

Office 365

Office 365 is a service available to all students and staff in the Upper Canada District School Board. You can access your email by logging in to Office 365 from any web browser, on virtually any device, by going to <u>http://office.ucdsb.ca</u>, even on home computers! Office Online is a free product suite which allows you to create and edit files using lightweight, web-based versions of Word, Excel, OneNote and PowerPoint. No

installation is required. In addition, Office 365 allows each student one free download of the entire suite of programs on his/her personal computer.

- Log in to the Outlook Web App (OWA) by going to <u>http://office.ucdsb.ca</u>
- 2) Click the **Office** 365 logo in the top-left corner of the screen.
