### Code Heroes - Computer Programming at VCI

Code Heroes teaches everything from webmaking to game-making, graphic design, to writing scripts, and we use free web-based tools to do so. Our students learn all about problem-solving, creativity, and logical and critical-thinking. The hands-on aspect of what we teach allows youth to dive in, build their confidence, and to consider career opportunities in the tech sector. #### **Guest Speaker - Nick Foley**

At 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 18, Nick Foley will be visiting Vankleek Hill Collegiate Institute. Nick Folev is the founder of Celebrate the Hero and Move for Inclusion. initiatives that motivate and empower people of all ages to make a difference by propagating good through action. Nick has had the privilege pf speaking all over North America and is also the author of two book: "Act Like You've Been There" Rules For My Brother" which is a guide to living with integrity and perpetuating good citizenship, and most recently the children's book "Kapernakus" (Ka-pern-a-akus) which focuses on self-esteem and inclusion. Most recently Move for Inclusion took Nick on a coast to coast bike trip from Victoria BC to St John's NFLND, stopping at various locations to speak about Inclusion of all people without bias. Nick was able to complete his 8312 km journey on July 25th, 2015 after 95 days on the bike. On his ride Nick spoke to thousands of people on the importance of creating a culture of understanding and acceptance as well as raising money for charities. Nick is the very proud father of beautiful Brynn, from whom he has learned more than he ever thought imaginable. She has been, and continues to be the greatest teacher in his life. His high-octane presentation is sure to keep our students engaged and leave them with words and thoughts to live by. The content of the presentation is centred around one key question, "How do you want to be remembered?" Nick will speak to our students about inclusion, taking action, finding our way, and giving. Through his anecdotal tales, our Rebels & Warriors will meet the colourful characters that have inspired Nick throughout his life. We look forward to this wholeschool presentation.

**Soccer News**: This fall, we were excited to have almost 30 girls come out for soccer. Over the past few years we have only had enough at tryouts to make one varsity team, but this year we are offering both Junior and Senior teams, coached by Mrs. Sauvé, and Ms. Dagg. Our first tournaments were promising, with the juniors winning over Rockland, and just falling a few goals short to St. Thomas. The seniors started out their day strong, with a big win over Plantagenet, but lost to Hawkesbury and Le Sommet. Going into week two we will be focusing on positioning, and hopefully

having a few call ups from the junior team to support the older girls. Ms. Dagg is especially proud of the senior girls who have played for four years together now, and are stepping up in leadership roles to keep a positive team vibe.

**Ir Boys Soccer:** After 4 games, the junior boys soccer team sits atop of the junior standings in the PRSSAA with 9 points. The boys got off to a great start with wins against Le Relais 5-0 and Casselman (ESCC) 2-1. Damien Gauthier led the charge in the 5-0 win by scoring twice while Luke Goosen, Michael Sauve and Tyler Burmeister each added singles. Matthew Miller was responsible for shutting out the Alexandria team. The second game of the day was a lot tighter. Damien Gauthier scored on a penalty kick with only a few minutes left to give the Warriors a 2-1 win. Jorge Vazquez opened the scoring on a wonderful free kick from 30 yards away. Week 2 started off with a tough first half which ended with the Warriors on the wrong side of a 3-0 score against Embrun. The boys bounced back nicely against Le Sommet with a 2-1 win. Damien Gauthier scored in the early minutes of the first half and everything indicated that the Warriors would be able to hold off their opponents the rest of the way. Le Sommet, was able to score with only 3 minutes left in the game to tie the game 1-1. Once again, Damien Gauthier was able to put a ball passed the goaltender with only 1 minute left giving the Warriors their 3rd win of the season. The Jr Warriors will play their final two regular season games on October 11th, with the playoffs scheduled for October 16th. The top 4 teams in the league will advance to the playoff round. So far, the coach has been really impressed with the extremely solid crop of grade 9 students that have come in this year. #### French Immersion @VCI

There are currently 2 different French certificates available to students at Vankleek Hill Collegiate: **EXTENDED FRENCH CERTIFICATE** (7 credits) and **IMMERSION FRENCH CERTIFICATE** (10 credits). Upon graduation, all students who achieve 30 credits (compulsory & elective), who complete a minimum of 40 hours community service, and who complete the OSSLT requirement, will receive an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), like all other Grade 12 students in Ontario. In addition to their diploma, a student can receive either an EXTENDED or IMMERSION French certificate. The certificate indicates that they have completed a specific number of high school credits entirely in the French language.

The following French courses are required for both certificates:

FIF1DF – Grade 9 Extended/Immersion French FIF2DF – Grade 10 Extended/Immersion French FIF3DF – Grade 11 Extended/Immersion French FIF4UF – Grade 12 Extended/Immersion French

Any combination of the following French courses can be used for either 3 more credits for the Extended Certificate and 6 more credits for the Immersion Certificate.

CGC1DF – Canadian Geography
CHC2DF – Canadian History
CHV2OF/GLC2OF – Civics and Careers
PPL1OF/2OF/3OF/4OF – Healthy Active Living,
Grade 9-12
HSP3UF – Anthropology, Psychology, Sociology
CO-OP Credits in a French workplace

Students are not required to take all of the French courses offered every year. In some cases, scheduling conflicts arise and students may need to decide between a compulsory credit or a pre-requisite credit for post-secondary (college or university) and a French certificate credit.
