Bullying Awareness Week @VCI

BULLYING Awareness Week - Week of November 19th -25th, 2017. Bullying is defined as a form of repeated, persistent and aggressive behaviour directed at an individual or individuals that is intended to cause (or should be known to cause) fear and distress and/or harm to another person's body, feelings, self-esteem or reputation. Bullying occurs in a context where there is a real or perceived power imbalance. When Bill 212 was introduced, it added bullving to the list of activities that a student can be suspended for at schools in Ontario. A guick and effective reaction to bullying is very important to ensuring a safe and caring school environment. However, a proactive approach to bullying can be more effective in helping to reduce or eliminate the number of bullying incidents in a school. Don't forget to check out local post-secondary **OPEN HOUSE** events:

Algonquin College on Wednesday, November 8th from 9:00 a.m. to 12 p.m. St. Lawrence College on Saturday, November 18th. If you are interested in a different post-secondary institution, check the website for more info. Registration for these events are sometimes required. This is the only OPEN HOUSE event before you are required to apply to University (January 17th, 2018) and College (February 1st, 2018). We have met with all graduating students prior to end of September to discuss and to begin planning for their post-If you have any questions secondary options. regarding your child's educational pathways, no matter what grade, please do not hesitate to contact the guidance office. Please continue to access the MyBlueprint.ca site to further your investigations of career and post-secondary pathways. If students have done community hours over the summer, make sure to drop by Guidance to fill out the paperwork and get them recorded. Students need 40 hours of community service to obtain a diploma.

Attendance, Punctuality and Safe Arrival

Students must attend school daily in order to have the best chance at being successful. **Parents or guardians, if your child is going to be absent from school or late, please contact the general office by 7:45 am** or leave a phone message. If we have not heard from a parent or guardian, we will contact the home of any student who is not in school when the attendance is taken. To contact parents electronically, staff may use Office 365 (for routine class or school emails, to look up contact information or send calendar invitations to students) or alternatively, MIR3 for urgent notifications. To Register for My Family Room call the general office at 613-678-2023 and ask to be added to MyFamilyRoom. All you need is an email address.

Office 365 is a service available to students and staff in

the Upper Canada District School Board. You can access your email by logging in to Office 365 from any web browser, on virtually any device, by going http://office.ucdsb.ca. even computers! Office Online is a free product suite which allows you to create and edit files using lightweight, web-based versions of Word, Excel, OneNote and PowerPoint. No installation is required. In addition, Office 365 allows each student one free download of the entire suite of programs on his/her personal computer.

Students can access My UCDSB from any location that has internet connection. Step #1: Open your browser window and enter the following URL – my.ucdsb.ca. Then, click on My UCDSB image at the bottow right hand side of the main page. Then, log into your My UCDSB account.

French Immersion @VCI

There are currently 2 different French certificates available to students at Vankleek Hill Collegiate: **EXTENDED FRENCH CERTIFICATE** (7 credits) and IMMERSION FRENCH CERTIFICATE (10 Upon graduation, all students who credits). achieve 30 credits (compulsory & elective), who complete a minimum of 40 hours community service, and who complete the OSSLT requirement, will receive an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), like all other Grade 12 students in Ontario. In addition to their diploma, a student can receive either an EXTENDED or IMMERSION French certificate. The certificate indicates that they have completed a specific number of high school credits entirely in the French language.

The following French courses are required for both certificates:

FIF1DF – Grade 9 Extended/Immersion French

 ${\it FIF2DF-Grade~10~Extended/Immersion~French}$

FIF3DF – Grade 11 Extended/Immersion French

FIF4UF - Grade 12 Extended/Immersion French

Any combination of the following French courses can be used for either 3 more credits for the Extended Certificate and 6 more credits for the Immersion Certificate.

CGC1DF – Canadian Geography
CHC2DF – Canadian History
CHV2OF/GLC2OF – Civics and Careers
PPL1OF/2OF/3OF/4OF – Healthy Active Living,
Grade 9-12
HSP3UF – Anthropology, Psychology, Sociology
CO-OP Credits in a French workplace

Students are not required to take all of the French courses offered every year. In some cases, scheduling conflicts arise and students may need to decide between a compulsory credit or a pre-requisite credit for post-secondary (college or university) and a French certificate credit.
