# After School Literacy and Numeracy Programs at VCI

As you know, grade ten students in Ontario are required to write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) on Tuesday, April 10, Please ensure that any medical 2018. appointments have been rescheduled if there is a conflict. Students are required to pass this test to receive an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. All staff at Vankleek Hill Collegiate Institute are committed to cultivating students' reading and writing skills across the curriculum as they work to become productive, contributing citizens within our community. In addition, in February and March, VCI will run an After School Literacy Program for all students requiring more support with specific reading and writing skills. Students will receive additional help to improve their chances of success on the literacy test. The program runs **Tuesdays** and Thursdays from 2:25-3:25 pm in our Learning Commons. These sessions will begin on Thursday, February 8th, and conclude on Thursday, April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2018. A letter and registration form has been mailed to all students in grade ten. In addition, in semester two, VCI will provide an After School Math Tutoring **Program** every **Thursday during semester** two, from 2:25-3:25 in the Learning Commons beginning on Thursday, February 15. This math tutoring support will complement and support students in math for semester two.

My Family Room represents the interface that parents use to set their contact preferences like phone numbers and email addresses.

Parents can also view their sons' and daughters' Office 365 calendar through this interface.

Parents have the ability to self-

register for a My Family Room




account and choose to use their preferred social media account OR create an account using an email address of their choice (except for UCDSB employees who cannot use their UCDSB email address as their primary email address) with a My Family Room password. Parents just need to register their email with the school as a first step. Parents can visit myfamilyroom.ca and click on the sign-up button to begin the process. Parents will then receive an email called 'account confirmation'. When they confirm the account, the parent will be registered. Parents can also download a free My Family Room app for their phone. From the calendar, parents can then follow school activities or classroom activities taking place at VCI.

#### Athletics - VCI Curling

The boys curling team played in the Gore Mutual Regionals on Feb 2-3-4, 2018 in Vankleek Hill and Maxville. The Warrirors had a difficult time vs Fellowes High School (Pembroke) in their first game losing 8-5. Fellowes eventually went on to win the "A" division of the Regionals. The boys then Saturday in Maxville vs East played on Northumberland Secondary School in the "B" side of the bracket and needed to win to stay alive. They played much better and won 9-5. On Sunday, the Warriors needed to string together 3 consecutive wins in order to move on to the Provincial tournament and that's exactly what they did. VCI defeated Loyalist (Kingston) 9-0, All Saint (Kanata) 9-3 and North Dundas District High school 5-4.

The boys have now qualified for the Provincial tournament for the second consecutive year, which will be held in Sarnia on February 15-17. This tournament allows the top 8 provincial teams to face off against each other.

#### **Emergency Response Procedures**

VCI continues to practice our emergency preparedness with staff and students. If your son or daughter has been recently diagnosed with a concussion, an anaphylactic allergy, asthma, diabetes, or any other serious medical condition, please notify the school so that we can develop a 'plan of care' with parents, students and the school to ensure our students' safety and health. #### **Personal Property**

The school will not be responsible for the loss, theft or damage to any personal items brought to the school. Bicycles should be locked, while skateboards, iPods, Smartphones, laptops, tablets and MP3 players should be safely stored in a locker. Students should NOT bring valuables to the gym locker room at any time. Students must have permission from their teacher to use devices in the classroom – curriculum and learning purposes only. Students are encouraged to keep their locks on their lockers for safety purposes.

**Tobacco and Smoking** Please be reminded that all grade nine and ten students are not to be in possession of tobacco or tobacco products at VCI – including VAPES. Please be reminded that students are not to leave school property during the 10 minute morning and afternoon breaks.

#### **Character Always Education**

Character Education is valued at VCI. Monthly, staff nominate male and female students from grades 9-12 who exemplified the character trait highlighted for that month - September (respect); October (responsibility); November (courage); December (generosity); and in January, the trait is perseverance. Several Rebels and Warriors were recognized for demonstrating 'courage' 'generosity' for November and December respectively. Character Education is embedded in the curriculum that we teach and the actions we perform at Vankleek Hill Collegiate Institute. 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#### Employment Services Centre Invests \$250,000.00 in Prescott-Russell's Youth

The Employment Services Centre (CSEPR) proudly announced that it will invest \$250,000 over the next five years in Prescott-Russell's youth through its Job Succession Scholarship Program. This new program, developed and implemented by the centre, will be available in early spring 2018 in all participating schools of Prescott-Russell – including Vankleek Hill Collegiate Institute. The scholarship program will be available for 2018 to 2022 inclusively, and it is open to grade 12 students as well as local employers in need of specialized labour. Ten scholarships of \$5000 each will be offered annually by the Centre with all participating schools in Prescott-Russell. In summary, the employer in need of specialized labour will inform the CSEPR of his interest to participate in the program, and if retained by the selection committee, the job offer will be presented to students in participating schools so that those interested in a trade or a profession can apply for Once the interview process is the position. completed by the employer, the student chosen for the position will receive confirmation of a guaranteed job with the employer when the student's postsecondary studies are completed. The Centre will then grant a \$5000 scholarship to the student to be paid in two instalments as per the Job Succession Scholarship Program. This is a unique and exceptional opportunity for VCI students and the youth in the Prescott-Russell area.
